Dear Former Students & Staff

I had not expected to be writing this greeting this year as the election of Chairman is, by tradition, of one year duration. The Vice-Chairman automatically takes on this role at the next AGM. Unfortunately, for family reasons, he was not able to do this, hence my writing again.

May I take this opportunity to thank all the officials and members of the WCA committee for their continued support and commitment to the association. Attending committee meetings is not the best way to spend a Saturday morning-especially if you have to travel long distances. If there are any former members of the College who are interested in becoming committee members please do not hesitate to contact the alumni secretary (Jackie Glenn:glennja.ad@wymondhamcollege.com).

As far as State Boarding is concerned, we live in interesting and exciting times. The government has now realised what an excellent contribution state boarding is making to the education process. A sum of £25 million has been allocated for the development of state boarding schools, of which Wymondham College has secured nearly £10 million for development. When I last visited the College it resembled a building site. The construction of an additional

boarding house for 115 Year 13 (upper sixth) students in single rooms with en suite facilities has now commenced as have (a) a new administration wing, (b) extra classrooms and (c) an astro-turf. The latter, hopefully, will be in use in time for the Summer Fayre. The WCA is making a contribution to the Summer Fayre and I hope as many of you as possible will be able to attend this function in support of the Parents & Staff Association.

Other events of the WCA can be found elsewhere in this Newsletter. A suggestion has been made that we change the name of the association to the 'Old Wymondians' and this will be formally proposed at the next AGM.

### WCA 100 CLUB REPORT - 2007 By Phil Robinson (66-73)

This is the third year that we have been operating the WCA 100 club and we have generated £2,660.00 in funds supporting the running of the WCA (as at 30th September 2006). This is an encouraging sum, but it could be much higher. At present we only have just under 80 members who subscribe £5.00 per month into the draw. This is an increase from the 73 members that we had last year. Of the monies raised, 40% is redistributed in prize monies with 60% being retained by the WCA. The cost of producing, printing and posting the yearly newsletter is in excess of £2,500.00, so it can be seen that the current income from the draw is just covering the newsletter costs. We are therefore reliant on reunion profits and donations to ensure that the WCA can operate effectively. The fact that there will not be an official reunion this year will obviously have an effect on our operating costs. The cost of the Alumni Secretary and office support is funded directly by the College, to whom we are very grateful.

For those of you who may wish to join, the monthly payment can be made by Standing Order but we are happy to accept yearly payments of £60.00 from

anyone who would prefer to subscribe in that way.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT 2005-6

The accounts for the year to 30th September 2006 showed a satisfactory financial picture with total funds of £5302 at the year-end, reflecting an increase in net funds held of £1370 from the previous year.

The 101 Club continues to be the main source of income generating £2660 (net). Many thanks to Phil Robinson for his unstinting devotion to meeting me each month at a choice public house to perform the Draw and consume a pint or two of real ale!

The Reunion produced a surplus on the night of £757. My thanks to all 'volunteers' and those that donated raffle prizes.

Donations of £1250 were also received from various sources, be it from the appeal in last years Newsletter, commissions on purchases made via the **www.wcremembered.co.uk** website or other sources.
